What Is Accountability?

Icebreaker

Select two or three girls to do some simple tasks such as taking something to a sponsor in another group, leading the girls in some songs, helping you pick up trash, or arrange chairs before the club meeting. Call on each individually, and ask her to explain what she did for you. Then ask each one to give a reason why she did the task the way she did. You may have to help the girls by asking questions such as “Why did you take it in your right hand instead of your left?” “Why did you do it this way instead of another way?” “Why did you take that route to the clubroom instead of another?” Give small prizes to the girls who helped you, and thank them.


Club Distinctives

Have you ever heard of the word *accountability*? What does it mean? (Allow for response. Take time for the girls to complete “Accountability Definition” in their Friends Journals.)

Accountability Definition

Accountability is simply giving a reason or explanation for an action you’ve done. Read 2 Corinthians 5:10 and Romans 14:10-12. A day will come when you will stand before the judgment seat of Christ. All of us will

Role-Play

Suppose someone from another country is visiting your school. She speaks some English but not a lot. Your teacher has assigned you as her vocabulary partner. How would you explain to her what accountability is? Write your explanation in the space provided. Role-play this with a friend.

(Divide the club into groups of two to role-play the "Accountability Definition.")

Accountability is simply giving a reason or explanation for an action you've done. In the Icebreaker, the girls who helped had to give an explanation—an account—for what they did. The Bible says that one day we will stand before God and give an account for what we've done with our lives. *(Ask a girl to read 2 Corinthians 5:10 and another to read Romans 14:10–12.)* A day is coming when we will stand before the judgment seat of Christ. Everyone will appear before God to give an account for what she did in this life. How does that make you feel? Should that affect the way you act? *(Allow for response. Take time for the girls to complete "Life Account" in their Friends Journals.)*

Stretch girls' social skills with plenty of opportunities for interaction.

Life Account

In the space provided below, give an account for everything you've done today. Some questions are given to get you started.

1. What was the first thing you did when you woke up this morning?
2. How did you react to your family today?
3. Did you have all your homework ready for school? Why or why not?
4. How did you treat your friends today?
5. Did you lie, cheat, or say anything unkind to someone today?



Journal Activities help the girls apply the lesson to their lives.

We will also give an account for what we accomplished for God. He has given each of us specific talents and abilities, and someday He will ask us what we did

How should this affect the way we talk to others? (Allow for response. Take time for girls to complete "Word Check" in their Friends Journals. Discuss their answers when they've completed it.)

Read Matthew 12:36,37. Not only will we give an account for our actions and for our lives, we'll also give an account for every word we speak.

Word Check

As a group, brainstorm a list of positive words you want to use in your conversations with others. These should be words you will be proud to give an account for on the Day of Judgment.


(Lead the girls in a brainstorming session to list positive words to use in conversation with others.)



Journals are a great opportunity for girls to chronicle their walk with God and the character they develop.

Repetition helps girls remember what they learn.

Closing

This week encourage your club to remember that they will one day stand before God and give an account for their every word and action. 

Prayer

Pray the prayer found in Psalm 19:14.

Pray that God will enable the girls to guard their words and their actions and give them opportunity to use their talents for His glory this week.
